

HTML forms contd...

HTML value attribute

The HTML value attribute defines the initial value or default value of an input field.

Example:

```
<form>
  <label>Enter your Name</label><br>
  <input type="text" name="uname" value="Enter Name"><br><br>
  <label>Enter your Email-address</label><br>
  <input type="text" name="uname" value="Enter email"><br><br>
  <label>Enter your password</label><br>
  <input type="password" name="pass" value=""><br><br>
  <input type="submit" value="login">
</form>
```

Output:

Enter your Name

Enter your Email-address

Enter your password

Note: In password input filed the value attribute will always unclear

HTML disabled attribute

The HTML disabled attribute when applied then it disable that input field. The disabled field does not allow the user to interact with that field.

The disabled input field does not receive click events, and these input value will not be sent to the server when submitting the form.

Example:

```
<input type="text" name="uname" disabled><br><br>
```

Output:

Enter User name

Enter your Email address

Enter your password

HTML size attribute

The size attribute controls the size of the input field in typed characters.

Example:

```
<label>Account holder name</label><br>
```

```
  <input type="text" name="uname" size="40" ><br><br>
```

```
  <label>Account number</label><br>
```

```
  <input type="text" name="an" size="30" ><br><br>
```

```
  <label>CVV</label><br>
```

```
  <input type="text" name="cvv" size="1" ><br><br>
```

Output:

Account holder name

Account number

CVV
